Menopause and Liver Adenomas



Patient:

49-year-old female

Presenting issue:

Menopause symptoms

History



Previous liver adenomas diagnosed in a different country.

No information available regarding previous adenomas.

Advised against hormone therapy in the past. Tried non-hormonal methods for menopause symptom relief.

Advice



- Oral contraceptives are contraindicated.
- Limited information on HRT use with adenomas.
- Testosterone is contraindicated.
- Estrogen can stimulate adenoma growth, leading to pain and bleeding risk.
- No evidence of increased risk of malignant transformation.

Outcome



- Obtain updated MRI under hepatology supervision.
- Discuss risks and benefits of HRT with the patient after MRI.
- If HRT is considered, close monitoring with imaging for growth would be necessary
